### Task 4- Bibliography

Bibliography- you must have one to show where your information is from, you must site where your information is from.

- You need to reference all your sources of research to show where you have got your information. So the reader can look at them if they wish and to show where you got your information from such as: books, journals, websites, through studies of others' work made during a museum or gallery visit.
- Collect the date, title, author, and place information when you use the source. It is much easier than having to go back later and find it.
- Add the information as you find it because it can take time to do it properly.
   You don't want to have to go back at the end of the course to complete it.
