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Introduction:

- Can have majority of components/units of the course “banked” by the end of Year 10 for most vocationals
- Reduces workload and stress in Year 11 when other subjects are being completed (GCSEs)
- Opportunity to complete /controlled assessment-coursework rather than an exam only based qualification
- There is a resit exam opportunity for most vocationals (resit grade counts)

KEY POINTS

- All vocationals now have a 'terminal rule' (coursework before exam)
- Concerns with the above (attendance is key, no holidays during term time)
- Resits (importance of passing first time)
- Importance of learners achieving the best mark in all coursework/controlled assessments
- Students staying on top of classwork, homework etc.
