The Graduate Premium

- ▶ 80% of students are financially better off than they would have been if they'd skipped higher education.
- ► Graduates earn on average 20% more over their working life than those that did not go to university.
- Women's earning increase by £100K on average with a degree and £130k for men over the course of their working life after student loan payments and tax are factored in.

News story

Graduates enjoy £100k earnings bonus over lifetime

New research shows majority of graduates are better off for going to university and empowers students to make informed career choices.

Data Warning:

The costs of repaying student loans are not factored into calculations of the graduate premium.

Career Prospects

- It remains the case that some careers are not accessible without higher level qualifications.
- Graduate starting salaries vary enormously. These are the most lucrative degree subjects.

UK universities with highest earning graduates

- Graduate prospects vary depending on the institution. Attendance at some universities compared to others will statistically increase the likelihood of a higher salary 5 years after leaving.
- Results may be skewed by the north/south divide. Students leaving southern universities may stay in the south and as a consequence earn more.

The Cost of University

- ► Tuition fees are currently capped at £9,250 per year. All students irrespective of background can take out a tuition fee loan.
- The maximum maintenance loan, for students living away from home, is £13,348 (studying in London) and £10,227 (outside London). It's £8,610 if the student lives at home.
- All students, irrespective of household income, can take the minimum maintenance loan. Currently it's £6,647 (studying in London) and £4,767 (outside London). It's £3,790 if the student lives at home. The implicit expectation is that parents/the household will top-up.
- ► The average cost of studying for a degree, tuition and maintenance costs included, currently stands at £66,560.





The Real Cost of Higher Education



- ▶ Just under half of students will never fully repay their loans. Students pay back their loans at a rate of 9% above the set repayment threshold.
- ► The more you earn the more you'll pay.
- ► It's repaid via PAYE, like income tax, and doesn't go on your credit file. However, it will affect affordability for loans and mortgages.
- ▶ A key change: Students now repay loans over 40 not 30 years. The repayment threshold has been reduced too. £25,000 to 2027 then it will rise in line with CPI. Fact: your children will pay more.

Key Questions

- What is the ranking of the University?
- How good is the institution for the course studied?
- What are the employability rates from the institution/course?
- How likely is your child to get a First or 2(i)?
- Affordability? Regional cost of living differences have a huge impact.
- Does a sandwich course or additional year add value?
- How much contact time is there?



Higher Level Apprenticeships

- ► The Apprenticeship route is another way of gaining a higher education but without the fees.
- ► The employer will pay the tuition fees and the apprenticeship is salaried throughout.
- ► Higher level apprenticeship starts (Level 4 and above) increased by 6.1% in 2022/2023 compared to the previous year.
- There is growing momentum behind apprenticeships. Employers like GCHQ, Siemens, Price Waterhouse Coopers are widening their apprenticeship offer at pace.
- ► From September 2024 the NHS is piloting Medical Doctor Apprenticeships.




Apprenticeships Explained

- ► Higher and Degree apprenticeships go from level 4 to 7.
- ► They are the equivalent to a foundation degree and above.
- ► They typically take 3 6 years to complete.
- Degree apprenticeships include 20% off-thejob training.
- ► Though salaries vary depending on the employer all apprentices earn at least the apprentice national minimum wage. This is currently £8.60.

Researching Apprenticeships

- Most apprenticeships can be located at the GOV.UK website.
- Apprenticeship opportunities are updated daily. Start looking for apprenticeship opportunities from July 2024 but most will become available from September 2024 onwards.
- You can also find them via UCAS, direct from the employer and the Apprenticeships website.



Applying for Apprenticeships

- Increased demand means that competition is increasingly tough.
- Students are supported with their apprenticeship applications just as much as with UCAS.
- Each employer will have a different application process, you need to read the vacancy carefully and ensure you understand any deadlines and next steps.
- In most cases the applicant submits a CV and answers questions about themselves. If you get through the first stage, you'll be invited to an interview.
- Applying for an apprenticeship is not an easy option. It's far more demanding than a UCAS application.
