







# How Are We Operating?

What I want to do is to give you an insight into where we come from...

We have heaps of specific goals we work towards...

We both want the same thing - you have your child and we have all your children - so we'll have to accept that we'll operate in different ways...

DEMANDING	AUTHORITATIVE Relationship with child is two-way. Both sides speak and listen.	AUTHORATARIAN Relationship with child is controlling and power-assertive. One sides speaks, the other side listens.		
UNDEMANDING	PERMISSIVE Relationship is over- generous / lenient. Low levels of control.	REJECTFUL Relationship is minimal or withdrawn / Uninvolved.		

## Year 7 Profile...

There are 8 forms - 2 per House.

They are heading towards GCSEs in Summer 2029...

Statistically we are targeting 90% (NA - 2023 = 65% / SCHOOL - 2024 = 81.6%) getting a 4+ in GCSE English & Maths...

210 students
50.5% boys / 49.5% girls
Slightly Above Average for Ability

**21.5%** are 'Disadvantaged' (NA - 2023 = 27.1%)

**16.7%** are **SEND** (NA - 2019 = 14.8%)

**7.1%** are EAL (NA - 2023 = 18.1%)



## Tutor Group...

To Year 7s this often appears to the beall-and-end-all...

Over time the regularity of contact will reduce; Eg - setting, banding, options, Year halves...

It can be a force for long-lasting relationships, a sense of belonging and a feeling of home...

It can become 4 x 25mins per week...

It will support... It will help... It will encourage... But it is a part of a bigger context...

It is important in lots of levels - but functionally it is a block to run a timetable...



## House Life...

Our House system was designed to create identity, mobilise competition, integrate Year groups, and bring fun...

## Attendance...

This is an area where school and home can fall out.

Phone-calls, letters, meetings, etc.

Our job is to support every child's education.

If a child is ill then they are ill - but there is a cost (see opposite).

Rewards... Holidays... SCC... Fines...

#### **Summer 2023 Exams:**

-90% = 55% got GCSEs in English & Maths

-90% = -0.15 Progress v Expected Grades

90-95% = 86% got GCSEs in English & Maths

90-95% = 3/4 Grades Progress v Expected Grades

95%+ = 91% got GCSEs in English & Maths

95%+ = 1¼ Grades Progress v Expected Grades

## Achievement / House Points...

These are Reward Points - and they come for many different reasons.

Ability is not a factor - everyone has a chance.

They become harder to sell higher up the school - but we incentivise with Proms, meetings, etc.

House Assemblies... Prize Giving Evening...

Inflatables... Ice-creams... Fun fairs...



## Behaviour Points...

These can be given out for many reasons - we log any 'concern' incidents and the categories match to points.

Typically they rise a little in Y8-Y9 and decline in Y10-Y11.

In Year 7 if you get to 40 there are significant problems... The most common score for all Years is <u>0</u>.

Rewards... Sanctions... Trips... Events...

#### **Summer 2023:**

27/30 of our lowest performing students got 50+ behaviour points...

#### **General Pointers:**

We look for reasons for behaviour - and look to address them; Eg - counselling, SEND, etc.

Engaged parents who work with the school are much less likely to have big problems...

## Support...

We have a 4-strong Student Support Team employed to alleviate problems, offer mentoring, respond to parents, deal with external agencies, etc.

Tutors, Heads of House, the Headteacher, everyone will chip in...

We bring in our own specialists too.

External support - School Nurses, CAMHS, Counsellors, etc - is minimal...

A word about our staff...

Fall outs... Clashes with 'friends'...

Even bullying will happen...

Teachers will not always come across as perfect...

Problems will come up amongst our 1,250 children...

We will <u>never</u> ignore it and we'll always address it however complex it might be...

We'll also be acting as the front line with Children in Care, Bereavement, Self-Harm, Domestic Violence, Online Safety, Sexual Abuse, County Lines, etc...

We encourage reading - the best way to boost exam results and learning...







# EduLink for Reports...

If you open up your EduLink now you'd see your child's target grade report in the Documents section...

Your child's Reports will appear here at the end of each term...

They will largely be data sets - though there will be an annual written tutor / senior teacher report.



EduLink also provides text messages, emails, etc...

## Target Grades...

The new DfE Performance Tables say our school the No.1 performing state school in Staffordshire (GCSE & A-Levels)...

This is for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year running... (2019, 2022, 2023)

Last time out we were in the Top 7% of schools - we scored better as a school in 2024.


We get a lot right...

So what gets this academic success?

Around 80% make expected progress - based on those SATs - and around 20% do not.



## Target Grades...

Your child's target grades are based on their KS2 SATs results - and these correlate with a GCSE grade. We also use data from CATs.

They are also weighted on the subject.

6.50 in Maths...

6.61 in English... History?

L2D in ICT & L2 in Drama

## Effort...


This is how hard they try - in all areas:

1 = Meeting Expectations

2 = Inconsistent

3 = Poor

The key is to be getting 1s - if they are 2s or lower you will have problems as time passes.

# The Y9 Pathways...


In Year 9 our knowledge of your child will inform their Pathway.
